6.1. Council Bill 2026-151 (Jenson)

A general ordinance amending Chapter 36, Article 4, Section 4.01B of the Land Development Code, 'Official Zoning Map,' by rezoning approximately 1.0 acre of property generally located at 2852 West Republic Road from County C-2 to GC, General Commercial District; and adopting an updated Official Zoning Map. (By: B&B Rental & Real Estate LP; 2852 West Republic Road; Z-14-2026)

6.2. Council Bill 2026-152 (Horton)

A general ordinance amending Chapter 36, Article 4, Section 4.01B of the Land Development Code, 'Official Zoning Map,' by rezoning approximately 130 acres of property generally located at 233 East Norton Road from County R-1, Suburban Residence District; R-SF, Single-Family Residential District; and Planned Development No. 165 and 165 Amended, to GI, Government and Institutional District; and adopting an updated Official Zoning Map. (By: Maranatha Village, Inc.; 233 East Norton Road; Z-15-2026)

6.3. Council Bill 2026-153 (Hosmer)

A general ordinance amending the Springfield City Code, Chapter 36, 'Land Development Code,' to incorporate recommended changes. (By: City of Springfield; City-wide; Land Development Code - Text Amendment Number 3.)

6.4. Council Bill 2026-154 (Carroll)

A general ordinance amending the Springfield City Code, Chapter 36, Article 10, Section 36-10.09.C.5, 'Marijuana & Medical Marijuana Uses,' to allow drive-thru facilities to operate until 1:30 a.m. (By: V3 MO Vending 5, LLC; Citywide; Marijuana & Medical Marijuana Uses Drive-Through Hours of Operation Amendment.)

6.5. Council Bill 2026-159 (Lee)

A special ordinance amending the budget of the Springfield Fire Department for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 in the amount of \$83,558.92 to appropriate fund balances from the Fire Department Community Room, Public Education, and Hazardous Materials Funds.

6.6. Council Bill 2026-161 (Jenson)

A special ordinance authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to enter into a Sewer Extension Cost Reimbursement Agreement with Camray Investments, LLC, for the recovery of proportional square foot costs of the construction of a sanitary sewer extension to serve Joint District 217 of Section 16 and establishing a sanitary sewer cost recovery area and a per square foot connection fee to reimburse the developer for proportional costs of construction of the sanitary sewer extension.

6.7. Council Bill 2026-162 (Carroll)

A special ordinance selecting Mauldin & Jenkins, Certified Public Accountants, LLC, as the City's independent auditor, pursuant to Section 2.14 of the City Charter; and authorizing the City Manager to execute a contract with said firm for independent auditing services for the City, including the Police Officers' and Fire Fighters' Retirement Fund, for Fiscal Years 2026 through 2030.

6.8. Council Bill 2026-163 (Lee)

A special ordinance authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to accept a grant renewal in the amount of \$100,000 from the Missouri Children's Trust Fund for use by the Springfield-Greene County Health Department to continue operating the Family Connects Program that offers no-cost home visits to parents of newborns in Greene County, Missouri; to enter into agreements necessary to carry out the grant; and amending the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget in the amount of \$100,000 to appropriate the grant funds.

- 6.9. Council Bill 2026-164 (Jenson, Adib-Yazdi, Horton, Hosmer)
A general ordinance amending Chapter 118 of the Springfield City Code, "Vehicles for Hire," Section 118-49, to require taxicabs operated in the City of Springfield to be inspected biennially, on years where no state vehicle inspection is required; repealing General Ordinance 6942; and accepting the report of the Finance and Administration Committee.
- 6.10. Council Bill 2026-165 (Hosmer)
A special ordinance authorizing a plan for an industrial development project for the Andy's Headquarters Project, consisting of the construction and improvement of a new headquarters campus; and authorizing the City of Springfield, Missouri to issue its Taxable Industrial Development Revenue Bonds (Andy's Headquarters Project), in a principal amount not to exceed \$32,000,000 and authorizing and approving certain documents and actions in connection therewith.

14.1. Council Bill 2026-160 (Lee)

A special ordinance authorizing the General Manager of City Utilities of Springfield, Missouri ("City Utilities") or his designee, on behalf of City Utilities, to enter into an agreement with Forvis Mazars, LLP to provide professional auditing services to City Utilities for fiscal years 2026-2030.

14.2. Council Bill 2026-168 (Carroll)

A special ordinance amending the City's Fiscal Year 2025-2026 General Fund operating budget by increasing revenue and expenses in the amount of \$438,503.95 to adjust for certain unanticipated revenue and associated offsetting expenses, adjust the salary budget for retirement payouts, and adjust interdepartmental budgets.

14.3. Council Bill 2026-169 (Hardinger)

A special ordinance amending the City's Fiscal Year 2025-2026 operating budget in various Special Revenue Funds by increasing revenue in the amount of \$459,195.61 and expenses in the amount of \$617,338.53 to adjust for certain unanticipated revenue and associated offsetting expenses, and appropriating \$158,142.92 in fund balance for transfer to the General Fund.

14.4. Council Bill 2026-170 (Hosmer)

A special ordinance amending the Park Board's Fiscal Year 2025-2026 operating budget by increasing revenues by \$1,147,000, to offset unanticipated expenditures of \$1,147,000, and increasing both revenues and associated expenses within the Golf Enterprise Fund by \$900,000, for an overall budget adjustment of \$2,047,000.

14.5. Council Bill 2026-171 (Lee)

A special ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 budget of the Airport, in the amount of \$4,000,000 to appropriate reserves from the Airport Operating Fund, Airport Capital Replacement Fund, Airport Car Rental Reserve Fund, and Airport Capital Reserve Fund to finance repairs related to a hailstorm event.

14.6. Council Bill 2026-172 (McGull)

A special ordinance amending Special Ordinance 28083 to terminate the Cost-Share Agreement and extend the Letter of Intent with United Soccer Leagues, LLC, through December 31, 2027, for the City-owned property located at 1109 East Trafficway Street, in order to enable continued feasibility studies and research to evaluate cost impacts, refine project scope, and clarify site details.
